## Undue haste in the programme development and delivery

Given the complex interconnections between giant pharmaceutical companies and the government, women simply cannot reply solely on the information they receive from any of these sources. The issue is complex.

### The marketing approach to delivering the programme



- Obscured the relationship between HPV and cervical cancer
- Overemphasised the individual risk of developing cervical cancer
- Failed to adequately communicate the risks, limitation and uncertainties about the vaccine
- Overstated what is known about the benefits

### Making informed decisions about future health practices

By far the greatest risk for women is that those who have been vaccinated, and even those who have not, may mistakenly believe that cervical cancer is no longer a problem and will be less conscientious about turning up for regular smears (Lewis, 2007)

- Gender neutral policies for sexual health interventions
- Careful attention to the role of the pharmaceutical industry in programme development
- Balanced and accurate information
- Cautious and integrated introduction of new interventions
