








Study team

4. Develop training on LBW substance use for GP, AOD and mental health sectors










ALICE Methods- ethnographic framework












Recruitment of same-sex attracted women >18yo, Australia-wide








Depression diagnosed %

- Are discrimination experiences influencing alcohol use?











AUDIT scores vs. depression and anxiety diagnoses and suicidality in the past year




Experienced discrimination regarding sexual orientation/gender identity in past year (% yes)



Alcohol and mental health service use at least once in the past 12 months



Range of barriers to service use for alcohol or mental health issues

- lack of information about services available
- inability to access services
- not ready to seek advice or help
- previous services used were not helpful
- concerns about confidentiality
- concerns about being judged about alcohol/MH
- fear of discrimination based on SO/GI
- prior experiences of discrimination based on SO/GI










Experiences of discrimination in health services based on sexual orientation/ gender id



Take home messages - Convenience sample of non-heterosexual women with

high levels of mental health disturbance and suicidality

moderate levels of alcohol use, smoking and illicit drugs discrimination a key association with MH disparities and harmful alcohol intake

service use is high, but barriers to use also high, especially for mental health
