










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As the arm of government closest to the community **local government** are in a unique position to change gender inequality by **adopting gender equity** practices





Consideration of Gender

3 of 11 local governments in the Grampians region considered gender and/or women's health in their last Municipal Public Health and Wellbeing Plan









- Opportunities to participate in sessions to highlight the importance of gender


